Current News / Situation	Templeton is in a state of emergency (16 MAR 2020); The Town Administrator (also the Incident Commander) has extended the closure of town offices until May 4th; this is in line with the Governor's previous action.				
	The week of 6-10 April was a busy week for your town. The clerk worked on the recommendation to the BoS for meeting and election planning, the finance team worked on strategies to operate in a fiscally uncertain environment, and the Health dept continued to coordinate all COVID19-related tasks and community questions. The town's priorities remain the same. Based on community feedback, we have changed the format of this status report to be easier to read on hand-held devices. There is a steady stream of state legislation coming to address municipal COVID-19 strategies, we are tracking. *Cover your mouth and nose with a cloth face cover when around others.* Cloth face coverings should not be placed on young children under age 2. COVID-19 symptoms of this infection may appear 2-14 days after exposure and include: Fever, Cough, and shortness of breath, and in severe cases, pneumonia (fluid in the lungs). Call your healthcare professional if you develop symptoms, and have been in close contact with a person known to have COVID-19.
