Current News / Situation

 Templeton is in a state of emergency (16 MAR 2020); The Town Administrator (also the Incident Commander IC) has extended the closure of town offices until June 30th

- Deputy Incident Commander: Working on flyer handout for ATM and Election protocols
- The Annual Town Meeting will be held on 17 June in the Narragansett Middle School Auditorium at 6 PM. Safety instructions have been posted at town hall and on the town's website www.templetonma.gov. The auditorium will be disinfected as will all equipment to be used. The community emergency response team will be present to assist the meeting. If you are experiencing COVID-like symptoms, we would ask that you not attend this meeting. Selective seating will be used to help maintain 6 feet distances between attendees, but families may sit together. Please use face coverings before, during, and when leaving the middle school and auditorium. A limited supply of face coverings are available, but if you cannot wear one, please observe 6 feet of distance.
- Baker-Polito Administration Initiates Transition to <u>Second Phase</u> of <u>Four-Phase Approach</u>;
 The following businesses will be eligible to reopen in Step One of Phase II as of June 8, with contingencies:
 - Retail, with occupancy limits;
 - Childcare facilities and day camps, with detailed guidance;
 - Restaurants, outdoor table service only;
 - Hotels and other lodgings, no events, functions or meetings;
 - Warehouses and distribution centers;
 - Personal services without close physical contact, such as home cleaning, photography, window washing, career coaching and education tutoring;
 - Post-secondary, higher education, vocational-tech and occupation schools for the purpose of completing graduation requirements;
 - Youth and adult amateur sports, with detailed guidance;
 - Outdoor recreation facilities
 - Professional sports practices, no games or public admissions;
 - Non-athletic youth instructional classes in arts, education or life skills and in groups of less than 10;
 - Driving and flight schools
 - Outdoor historical spaces, no functions, gatherings or guided tours;
 - Funeral homes, with occupancy limits
- COVID-19 symptoms of this infection may appear 2-14 days after exposure and include: Fever, Cough, and shortness of breath, pneumonia (fluid in the lungs). Call your healthcare team if you develop symptoms or have been in close contact with a person known to have COVID-19.




- National Cases: 2,104,268 (+18,577 ▼) *Rates are from CDC and MDPH.

Board of Health: Reports no new active cases in town; working on opening guidelines for Town Hall and new Burial guidelines w/DPW; States that NRHS Seniors Parade went well, graduation to be held this weekend; many restaurants have taken advantage of the ourdoor/patio seating and have opened

NRSD Facilities: closed for school session for remainder of acedemic year; Central Office (978) 939-5661; https://www.nrsd.org/district/resources-for-parents;

Senior Center/COA: closed; minimally staffed;

Food Pantry: open Tuesday 9-12am, Thursday 12-3pm and 5-7pm, Saturday 12-3pm;

Emergency Services: vestibules only; sign up for CodeRed on town website or text "templetonma" to 99411 or call (866) 939-0911; phone outreach on Wed; message board coming in for maintenance

DPW: full operations; office closed to public; cemeteries are closed, expanded burials will be allowed with designated safety measures; playgrounds closed; DPW installing clear barriers and chains for safety

TCTV: Cable Station 8, YouTube Channel;

Recreation: Rec Comm voted to cancel the spring Templeton Youth Softball season and Summer Camp Playground for 2020; Learn to Swim is also cancelled
