Response

Current News / Situation

- Templeton is in a state of emergency (16 MAR 2020); The Town Administrator (also the Incident Commander IC) has extended the closure of town offices until July 31st (reopening on 1 Aug)
- Deputy Incident Commander: developing post-ATM budget actions and maintaining situational awareness on CARES developments as well as Phillipston ATM budget inconsistencies.
- Baker-Polito Administration Initiates Transition to <u>Third Phase</u> of <u>Four-Phase Approach</u>;
 The following businesses will be eligible to reopen in Step One (1) of Phase 3 as of July 6th, subject to industry-specific rules concerning capacity and operations:
 - Movie theaters and outdoor performance venues;
 - · Museums, cultural and historical sites;
 - Fitness centers and health clubs:
 - Certain indoor recreational activities with low potential for contact;
 - Professional sports teams, under the authority of league-wide rules, may hold games without spectators
- On gatherings: Under the updated gatherings order, indoor gatherings are limited to eight people per 1,000 square feet, but should not exceed 25 people in a single enclosed, indoor space.
 - Outdoor gatherings in enclosed spaces are limited to 25 percent of the facility's
 maximum permitted occupancy, with a maximum of 100 people in a single enclosed
 outdoor space. This includes community events, civic events, sporting events,
 concerts, conventions and more. This order does not apply to outdoor, unenclosed
 gatherings if proper social distancing measures are possible.
- COVID-19 symptoms of this infection may appear 2-14 days after exposure and include: Fever, Cough, and shortness of breath, pneumonia (fluid in the lungs). Call your healthcare team if you develop symptoms or have been in close contact with a person known to have COVID-19.


