A 'volunteer of the month' initiative began this quarter and will continue as we recognize the many volunteers who are critical to the Center. Plans began for a Candidates forum hosted by the town to be held at the Center. The Citizen of the Year award was formally presented to Gail Noel, who was honored for her many years of dedication as President of the Friends of the Templeton Elders and as our Shine volunteer.
