Current News / Situation

• Templeton is in a state of emergency (16 MAR 2020); The Town Administrator (also the Incident Commander) has extended the closure of town offices until May 18th.

- Priorities in community: Personal Protective Equipment, Food Pantry (donations), Critical Staff; emergency team met 4/28 to develop recovery priority strategies
- The Templeton Board of Selectmen met on Wednesday, April 22nd and voted to extend the due date for 4th Quarter Real Estate Taxes from 4 May to 1 June; they also voted to approve the amended warrant for the Annual Town Meeting for 13 May with the understanding that the target date to be approved by the Moderator for 17 June; the board also voted to move the Annual Town Election to 22 June. - AlertsMA: Gov. Baker extends non-essential business closure until May 18, stay at home advisory remains in effect: www.mass.gov/covid-sjip



Town Offices and Partner Status:

Town Hall: closed until 18 May; use the website for transactions; BoS meeting of 4/22 moved 4th Quarter tax due date to June 1st, Annual Town Meeting Warrant to May 13th (Target is 17 June pending decision by Moderator); Town Election to June 22nd;

Board of Health: next meeting TBD; continual close coordination with Allied Health (Baldwinville Nursing); numbers updated 28 April; answered request for info on food establishments and protective wear (against CDC Guidelines)

NRSD Facilities: closed for school session for remainder of acedemic year; Central Office (978) 939-5661; https://www.nrsd.org/district/resources-for-parents; The NRSD School Committee meeting will take place on Wednesday, April 29th at 5pm, via the Zoom virtual meeting platform. This meeting will be live streamed with the help of Templeton Community TV through the TCTV YouTube Channel, which can be accessed via YouTube at https://bit.ly/3cujkPN

Senior Center/COA: closed; minimally staffed; EMD, CERT, and Senior Services have enabled a targeted 'wellness call' program, about 100/week

Food Pantry: open Tuesday 9-12am, Thursday 12-3pm and 5-7pm, starting 2 May, there will be Saturday hours! 12-3pm; Donations checks may be made out to: Town of Templeton ("Food Pantry" in the memo);

Emergency Services: vestibules only; sign up for CodeRed on town website or text "templetonma" to 99411 or call (866) 939-0911; emergency team met 4/28 to develop recovery priority strategies; recent CodeRed message (4/24): 3,531 phone calls, 610 emails

DPW: full operations; office closed to public; cemeteries are closed, however limited burials will be allowed with strict measures; playgrounds closed
