## Current News / Situation

- Templeton is in a state of emergency (16 MAR 2020); The Town Administrator (also the Incident Commander) has extended the closure of town offices until May 18<sup>th</sup>.
- Priorities in community: Personal Protective Equipment, Food Pantry (donations), Critical Staff; [emergency team developing recovery priority strategies](#)
- [Effective Wednesday, May 6, 2020, Governor Baker issued an Order requiring face masks or cloth face coverings in public places where social distancing is not possible. This applies to both indoor and outdoor spaces. Exceptions include children under the age of 2 and those unable to wear a mask or face covering due to a medical condition. - AlertsMA: Gov. Baker extends non-essential business closure until May 18, stay at home advisory remains in effect: [www.mass.gov/covid-sjip](http://www.mass.gov/covid-sjip)
- *COVID-19 symptoms of this infection may appear 2-14 days after exposure and include: Fever, Cough, and shortness of breath, and in severe cases, pneumonia (fluid in the lungs). 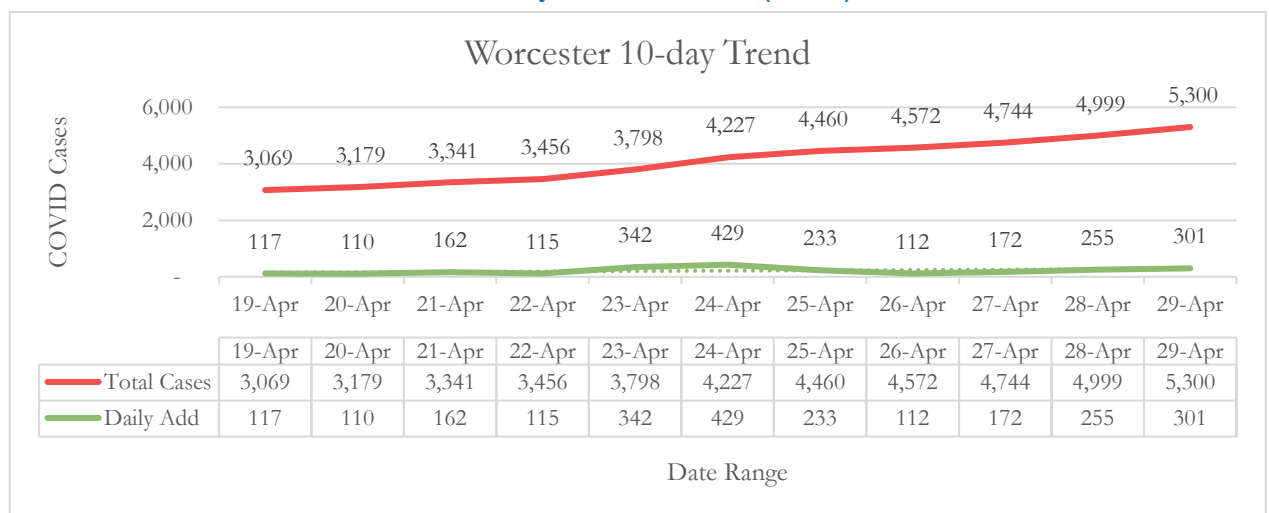


## COVID-19 Statistics

(as of 28 April 2020, updates on Tuesdays)</p> <p><b>Active</b> cases: (these numbers DO NOT include “recovered”) 56*</p> <p>Cases attributed to BNH (Alliance Health) 42*</p> <p>Cases attributed to Templeton residents 14*</p> <p>*The numbers posted include isolation and quarantine periods that have been completed; not all cases have been closed in the MAVEN reporting site but are continually updated.</p> <p>Previous cases:</p> <p>Recovered (out of quarantine/isolations) 22</p> <p>Total deaths including (BNH) 16</p> <p>Please be aware that there is no evidence to support that anyone who has had and recovered from COVID-19 is now immune; please continue to follow all protocols (hand washing, mask wearing, social distancing and stay at home and out of the public as much as possible).</p>
