The 4th Quarter has brought more speeding and noise complaints with the warmer weather.

The Station Project is finally nearing completion with an estimated move in during the week of July 29th. However, we will not be having a Grand Opening until later in the year sometime in September or October. This is to allow us to work out any kinks we might encounter during the move in.

As mentioned in the 3rd Quarter Report the department has been experiencing higher than normal mechanical issues with the cruiser fleet and just this week every SUV has been recalled for a catalytic converter and catalyst degradation issues.

We have met numerous times with Superintendent Casavant and OPM Matt Dunn to discuss the drop-off and pick-up at the new Templeton Center School and have worked on a plan, which will hopefully help alleviate the traffic during these time frames.

- On Saturday and Sunday there will be only one (1) officer coverage from 7am – 11am
- The SRO schedule will change from 7am – 3pm to 9am – 5pm, Monday thru Friday
- A formal request from my office will be presented to the Board of Selectmen to change the closing of local drinking establishments in town from 2am to 1am

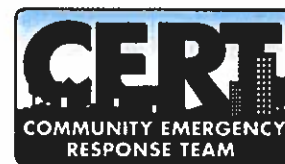

RE: **4th Quarter Report – Emergency Management**

Date: July 8, 2019

During this quarter, I attended the following meeting and training for Emergency Management...

1. May 22, 2019 – MEMA Quarterly EMD Meeting (Holden)
2. June 5, 2019 - Stone Bridge report from Milone & MacBroom at the Board of Selectmen Meeting
3. June 12, 2019 – Disaster Debris Management (Worcester)
4. June 18-19, 2019 – MEMA's All Hazards Emergency Preparedness Conference (Marlboro)
5. June 25, 2019 – WebEOC Training (Charlton)

The month of June ended a lengthy process associated with the severe Winter Storm that occurred in March of 2018. All allowable costs associated with this snow storm, for an allowable 48 hr. period were gathered. These costs came mostly from the DPW and I thank them greatly for their cooperation. When all was said and done, \$39,029.07 of allowable costs were submitted to FEMA. After an enormous amount of documentation, our submission for reimbursement was approved. FEMA reimburses 75% of the approved allowable cost, so on or about the 18th of June, the Treasurer received our reimbursement of \$29,271.80.

I submitted an application for a competitive Emergency Management Performance Grant (EMPG), for up to \$10,000.00. This grant had to be used to enhance specific areas in preparedness. I chose the area of "Sheltering of people and/or pets, including addressing the access and functional needs (including medical needs) of survivors". I expect to find out if our project is approved sometime in August.

2. May 27, 2019 – Memorial Day Parade (Assisted TPD with Traffic and Crowd control)
3. May 31, 2019 – NRHS Graduation (Assisted TPD by coordinating parking)
4. June 10, 2019 – Templeton CERT Meeting
5. June 18-19, 2019 – 3 CERT Members attended the MEMA 2-Day Emergency Preparedness Conference
