A Comprehensive study is necessary and appropriate for the following reasons:

- 1). The number of applications and/or inquires for permits, other zoning relief and building permits to establish wireless communication facilities is rapidly increasing.
- 2). The telecommunication field is experiencing rapidly evolving technology.
- 3). The Town of Templeton has a significant scenic and rural character, which is of interest in maintaining a high quality of residential life in the area
- 4). The Town of Templeton has a limited number of sites that are suitable for both the installation of wireless communication facilities and the erection of towers for such facilities.
- 5). The Town of Templeton must consider the probable future development in the community and must act carefully in a field with evolving law and technology.

B-Moratorium: No wireless communication facilities shall be erected in the town nor shall a building permit for any such facility be issued for a period of six months from May 9, 2000 except as provided below.

C-Exemptions: The following types of wireless communication facilities and towers are exempt.

- 1). Amateur radio towers-Construction or use of an antenna structure by a federally licensed amateur operator as exempt by MGL Chapter 40 Section 3.
