Article 1 To see if the Town will vote to accept the reports of the Town Officers as printed in the 2000 Town Report and to hear the reports of any committees as may be presented at this time.

Article 2 To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to accept and expend, consistent with their provisions, any and all State and Federal grants for which no additional appropriation by the Town is required for the ensuing year, and to apply for such other grants as they deem appropriate.

- A Revolving Fund for the Cemetery Department, to receive fees charged for weekend burials, and to authorize the Cemetery Commissioners to expend such funds for wages associated with such burials, provided that the amount to be expended in FY 2002 shall not exceed \$8,000.00.
- A Revolving Fund for the Communication Commission, to deposit rental fees collected for tower space on Ladder Hill and to authorize the Communication Commissioners to expend such funds to provide cellular phone service for all departments, provided that the amount to be expended in FY 2002 shall not exceed \$7,000.00.
- A Revolving Fund for the Electrical, Plumbing and Gas Inspectors, to deposit fees charged for inspections and to authorize these Inspectors to expend such funds for wages and expenses for inspections, provided that the amount to be expended in FY 2002 shall not exceed \$15,000.00.
- A Revolving fund for the Board of Health, to deposit receipts collected from the sale of recyclable goods and to authorize the Board of Health to expend such funds to expand the recycling program, provided that the amount to be expended in FY 2002 shall not exceed \$1,000.00.
- A Revolving Fund for the Parking Clerk, to deposit fines for parking violations and to authorize the Parking Clerk to expend such funds for expenses incurred in the collection of such fines, provided that the amount to be expended in FY 2002 shall not exceed \$500.00.

Article 57: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the construction of the Templeton center and the design and construction of the RT 68 area (Otter River) collector Sewers, Pumping Stations, Force Mains and Appurtenances: to determine whether this appropriation shall be raised by borrowing from the Massachusetts Water Pollution Abatement Trust, the U.S. Department of Agriculture, Rural Development, or otherwise, or take any other action relative thereto.

On a motion duly made and seconded, the Town voted to borrow four million, one hundred thousand dollars (\$4,100,000.00) for the purpose of

financing the construction and design of the Rt. 68 Area (Otter River, completing Phase IVC (Templeton Center) including Dudley road, Collector sewers, Pumping Stations, Force Mains and Appurtenances, including without limitations all cost thereof as defined in Section 1 of Chapter 29C of the General Laws: that to meet this appropriation, the Treasurer with the approval of the Selectmen is authorized to borrow \$4,100,000.00 and issue bond or notes under CHP. 44 of the General Laws and/or 29C of the General Law; that such bonds or notes shall be general obligations of the Town unless the Treasurer with the approval of the Selectmen determines that they should be issued as limited obligations and may be secured by local system revenues as defined in Section 1 of Chapter 29C: that the Treasurer with the approval of the Selectmen is authorized to borrow all or a portion of such amount from the Massachusetts Water Pollution Abatement Trust established pursuant to CHP 29C and in connection therewith to enter into a loan agreement and/or security agreement with the Trust and Dept. of Environmental Protection with respect to such loan, and for any other federal or state aid available for the project or for the financing thereof, and that the Board of Sewer Commissioners is authorized to enter into a project regulatory agreement with the Dept. of Environmental Protection, to apply for, accept and expend all funds available for the project.
