4th Quarter Report FY22

As in previous years the 4th Quarter is our time to refresh, reenergize and prepare for the next fiscal year. Once our operating budget was set for the next fiscal year at the Annual Town Meeting the command staff and I started to move forward with our FY23 planning. In the end the entire department did a great job wrapping up FY22 and preparing for FY23.

The Station Projects – We finally received the new HVAC plan and hope to have it prepared to go out to bid in short order. The new station sign is being structured and should be installed within the next 30 days. Once the new sign is installed the new flagpole will be installed. In the spring the plan is to reseed the front lawn and install some block work.

The new ACO truck was finally delivered in June and has since been put into service after lettering and lighting installation. The new F150 Interceptor has finally been submitted to the plant but does not have a build date yet. The new Explorer Hybrid Interceptor has been ordered with an expected delivery date of September or early October.

The new Axon Taser 7s and BWC 3s have been delivered and we are just waiting on training before they are put into service. Also, within the next 60-90 days we will be transitioning from our current duty weapon (S&W M&P .45) to the SIG Sauer p320 9mm with red dot optical and light. The switch was brought on by a new FBI report recommending the change and the lack of availability of part and ammo for .45 caliber weapons.

During this quarter, Emergency Management was involved in the following;

- The Comprehensive Emergency Management Plan (CEMP) was reviewed and approved by the Select Board.
- MEMA was passing out surplus PPE equipment to Cities and Towns looking to build up their supplies. An order was placed and delivered to Fire Station #2, where it was inventoried and stored.
- Sent in a request for reimbursement for the 2021EMPG, with the reimbursement arriving just prior to the end of the fiscal year.
- The Purple Air Sensors were received by the Town. These were installed at Town Hall, Fire Station #1, DPW, EOC and the Senior Center. Anyone can view the air quality at these locations by going to purpleair.com, clicking on Map and then Real-Time Map.
- A lot of time during this quarter has been spend on applying for 3 grants. Two of these grants have been submitted and the last one will be submitted soon.
 - #1: FEMA-4496-DR-MA-HMGP (\$25,000) This grant is for the sole purpose of updating Templeton's expired HMP.
 - #2: 21EMPG-Competitive Emergency Shelter Generator Subgrant (\$50,000) This grant is for obtaining a Generator for the Senior Center, (our Secondary Emergency Shelter).
 - #3: 19-20EMPG/CCP (\$5,000) This grant will be use to purchase additional equipment for Emergency Sheltering.
- CERT Program Activities
 - #1: CERT Rodeo (4/23/22) MEMA held this event in Leicester. Re-Hab truck (TEMA-5), CERT Trailer and other Equipment was taken and put on display. TCERT's Tom Collaro was a presenter at this event.
 - #2: Memorial Day Program at HS/Middle School complex assisted TPD with parking and traffic control.
 - #3: Memorial Day Parade assisted TPD with traffic control and road closures. TEMA-5 and EM-4 were both In the parade this year driven by our CERT members.
