

# FY 23 Fourth Quarter Report

#### Library/ Community Services

This quarter saw good attendance at Story Hour, class visits from Templeton Elementary School and the newly formed Stitching Group, until all three concluded at the end of June. Community Services team members completed their conflict of interest and open meeting law trainings. 'United to Feed' of North Central Mass set up a food collection box at the library, with a generous response from our community. The DCR and Davis Farmland passes were borrowed 8 and 4 times respectively. Preparation was underway for the summer reading incentives. The Farmers' Market opened on May 25 with a small but enthusiastic group of vendors and visitors. Exterior trim painting was done on the library's exterior. #### **Cultural Council**

The Cultural Council held one meeting, in May, to review the status of 2023 grants and to discuss plans for upcoming events including the Summer Concerts on the Common, the Kite Festival, and the Garden Tea at the Historical Society.

In June, two of those projects -- the Crossroads Concert and the Garden Tea were postponed (and postponed again) due to rain. Both were rescheduled to August.

Programs receiving TCC grants that did take place included a performance about Zelda Fitzgerald, at the Senior Center; Winchendon Winds concerts; the Regional Exhibition at the Fitchburg Art Museum; and the GALA Spring Art & Music festival. Members of the Cultural Council have been attending the funded projects, whenever possible, and have conducted on-going surveys of attendees to help gauge interest in various kinds and locations of programs.
