Community Services – FY 24 Second Quarter Reports

Library/ Community Services

In addition to steady circulation and visitation, this quarter saw great attendance at Story Hour as well as excitement about the projects the newly formed Stitching group have been working on. The final reports to the Board of Library Commissioners were completed and submitted, and the Board voted to certify the library at their December meeting. I worked on Community Services employee reviews, as well as the FY 23 library and senior services annual reports. I completed the library and senior services FY 25 budget requests. I presented requests to the Capital Improvements Committee. I participated in the Hazard Mitigation meetings. I worked with TCTV staff member, Sarah, on the Library's winter newsletter.

Senior Services

Another busy quarter at the Senior Center. Two trips were well attended, one to Newburyport and another to Stewart's Chocolate shop in Holden. A vaccine clinic offered flu and covid shots. Musical entertainment this quarter included performances by the Hubbardston singing swinging seniors, and holiday sing-a-longs with Dennis D'Ambrose, a concert by Sean Fullerton and a special afternoon of Christmas caroling with the Girl Scouts. The Lions Club sponsored a turkey dinner, which was held at the Otter River Sportsman Club. A magic show with a luncheon was a wonderful time, as was the Center's Halloween Party. Templeton Recreation offered a fun Christmas event with refreshments and a Christmas movie. Other programs included: basket weaving, pumpkin carving, leaf garland, bracelet making, and a custom foot-soak workshop. Jan Lefebvre and Jackie held a Saturday story time, with a visit from Dilly the service dog, and a book raffle for participants. The COA board met this quarter. Linda and Elaine attended the MCOA annual conference. Gail Noel offered a Health Care Options talk. The Center took possession of a Ford Explorer, which Templeton Police Department removed from its fleet, and Templeton Highway Department converted.
