Highway Department:

- Paving was done on Highland Avenue, S. Main Street, and Shore Drive. Highway crew assisted with prep., etc.
- The community sand shed was built. Special thanks to Fischett Construction.
- Crews have been working to get everything ready for the winter, such as plows and sanders.
- While out plowing the roads, H35 caught on fire and received significant damages.
- Beavers are a regular part of the crew's week. They need to check multiple areas regularly, including but not limited to Royalston Road, Gavin Road, & Rte. 68 flats to remove blockages that could cause flooding.
- Crews have been repairing multiple areas of wash outs due to the heavy rains, as well as opening and repairing (if needed) multiple culverts.
- Crews are trying to repair as many potholes as they can.
- The town auction was successful and is complete for this year.
- Several crew members took "All About Liquid Deicers" class that was offered by UMASS, class was held at the UMASS Transportation Center in Chicopee. The feedback from the employees that attended was all favorable.
- The Brine machine and tanks are set up and running with multiple crew members able to make the brine and run it.

Building and Grounds:

- Pine Grove and Greenlawn Cemeteries both have the water shut off and both been winterized.
- The bathrooms were completed at Gilman Waite.
- Multiple burial duties, and multiple flag duties took place.
- Installed foundations for multiple stones and flat markers and installed some of the flat markers.
- The former elementary school was broken into with severe damage sustained. Buildings and Grounds crew along with Highway crew worked together to clean up and re-secure the building.
- Worked on patching the roads at the cemeteries.
- Assisted Highway department on several projects.
- Working on the replacement fence pickets for the Pine Grove Cemetery.
- Moved multiple items at Senior Center and Town Hall.
- There were 7 Interments, 1 Lot sales, 3 Foundations, and 2 Lots re-deed.

In October Parks & Rec was in the Full swing of the Fall Soccer season. We employed 5 Referees and two coordinators Kayla, Britany and had over 24 volunteer Coaches / Assistant Coaches. We received a cooler from NRSD, and a portable stove burner from a storage facility at Pine grove Cemetery. Built a wall in the concession stand, The Back Serves window was installed and had our big freezer fixed. Purchased a popcorn Machine, Shelf racks and rolling station tables.

The Rain seems to be a big theme in the fall for the Softball program as well. We learn a lot about how to dry up the park's fields. The Softball season we employed 4 Umpires and had two volunteer Coordinators Vansessa, Lindsey from our Travel Spring season and around 20 Volunteer Coaches, assistant coaches. Our Coach pitch teams received Thank you medals and our Player pitch teams received pins and had playoffs. The Golden Yellow Leaf team won the Championship. We learn a lot being a new fall rec program and look forward to next year.

In November we were closing up the parks for the winter, and the bathrooms Gilman-Waite water was turned off and winterized. The new Batting cage net was taken down and stored. We continued work on planning Town Holiday Tree Lighting and Parade and Winter movie events. Registration was going on for the winter Basketball program.

Winter Basketball Open up December with Coordinator Ray Kauffman and Staff We have 28 teams, 5 Divisions, 265 players Residents / Non Residents from grades Kindergarten to twelve grade register for a successful opening season. Games are held on Saturdays 8am to 2pm in Templeton Elementary Gym, Narragansett Middle and High school gyms. We tried to work on finding gym spaces for practices and had settled with Sundays Mornings because limited gym time available for town.

The Commissioners together have been working on Basketball Policy updates, 2025 Parks and Rec Budget, 2023 Annual reports, Goals for Parks & Recreation for 2024. Voted on the pickle ball court bid, Sign the PARA Grant for Houghton Park. We Currently have three open sports and are looking for new members to join the Parks & Recreation Commission.
